**Target group:** The workshop is intended for 10 to 15 working journalists with professional experience in broadcast (Radio and TV), print or online media and an interest in environment, water, sustainable development issues. The participation of 1-2 trainers and educators of University / Higher education courses related to journalism is also envisaged to promote the outreach towards future information and media professionals.

**Objective:** To enhance the understanding of journalists working for broadcast, print or online publications on critical water management challenges facing the Mediterranean countries and possible solutions that are at the focus of the SWIM Programme (SWIM-Support Mechanism and Demonstration Projects). The information workshop will be an occasion to introduce to media and information specialists the Programme and eventually to plan/produce multimedia stories on related activities to inform effectively their audiences about sustainable water management policies and practices in the Southern Mediterranean Region.

Participants will have the opportunity to actively contribute to a debate about central issues presented by SWIM experts and possibly during a field visit to one of the Demonstration projects that will be implemented in the countries at focus.

Finally, the objective of the Information Workshops is also to set-up a sort of "Media Circle" specialized in environment/water management related issues in the SWIM Partner Countries.
